

Please read for important information about early release days

Dear Parents,

We are very excited that our achievement and growth scores increased this year and we have improved from an "Improvement Plan" by the state to a "Performance Plan"! One of the areas where we focused our attention last year was on using data to better inform our instruction and planning. We are continually working to better prepare all students for success on classroom performance and assessments as well as standardized tests. We want our students to be able to compete with others in school and life.

We are moving in the right direction and seeing a lot of positive improvements in our students'

levels of success as measured by classroom performance, classroom assessments and state assessments.

One of our biggest struggles continues to be finding the time to really dig into assessment data TOGETHER and use that data to create interventions, evaluate the effectiveness of our instruction and interventions, create new lesson plans to address the areas we need to address and to create meaningful, challenging and engaging activities for ALL students –whether they are struggling or need to be challenged.

We are proposing that we CHANGE our EARLY RELEASES (starting in November) to FULL DAYS of data analysis and team planning. This will offer us a rare opportunity to work as an entire teaching staff (classroom teachers, special education teachers, instructional coach, principal and potentially district support staff) to more accurately address the root causes of our challenges. If we decide to move in this direction, students would NOT attend school on those days.

We want to hear your feedback about **potentially** making this change. We will be collecting input starting NOW and going through September 22nd about your thoughts and feelings about making this a NON-STUDENT contact day and allowing our teachers this time to be even better prepared to meet the needs of all students. Our Building Leadership Team will be meeting the following week to look at the input collected and making a decision about whether or not we will begin this with our NOVEMBER date. Our September date will still be an EARLY RELEASE at 1:05. However, the POTENTIAL dates for the change to a full day without students at school would be **November 3rd, February 16th, March 16th and April 27th.** This would allow teachers an additional 28+ hours of collaboration with student learning as the focus.

Please complete the following Google Form to give your feedback. We also have paper forms you can fill out. You can also send me an email or set a meeting time if you have questions or other things you want to discuss. We will be discussing it at our BAM meeting on September 7th at 4:30 PM as well. Please give us your input.

We will communicate our decision based on all stakeholder input by the end of September.

District Wellness Policy changes

Due to changes in Federal rules, school districts must have standards for foods provided (not sold) to students. With copious amounts of public input, consideration of food allergies, and equity, as well as guidance from leadership, the below standards will **begin this SCHOOL YEAR!!!!**

In summary, the new standards will include:

- **Holiday Celebrations** Offer at least half "healthier" food options (using the district definition of healthier or your one customized by your school).
- **Birthdays** Birthday recognition/celebrations should not include shared food (e.g. food brought in by families for students to share).
- **Rewards** Do not offer food as a reward for behavior or academic performance, unless approved as a need by school leadership.


West Jeff Preschool News

BOY (Beginning of Year) Assessments:

Teachers have been busy assessing students in order to better inform their instruction. They are using the MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) test in 1st-5th grade. MAP measures academic progress in reading and math. Please see the information page in this edition of Bobcat News for more information. Also, on assessment days, all students were given reading tests to assess reading fluency and comprehension. These assessments are vital for teachers to inform their instruction. We are so proud of all students for their commitment and endurance. Student's testing data will be shared at parent conferences on Sept ember 19th and 21st.

Jr. Great Books will be starting again this fall. This is a resource that was purchased in order to bring rich literature to all students. JGB promotes critical thinking skills and guides students in analyzing texts. Students look forward to this small group setting where they can have these deep discussions. Some teachers are also adopting JGB as a shared reading text in order to work with the whole class around reading skills such as fluency and comprehension.

Building Bright Futures

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) – Grades 3 - 10



About MAP

Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) is an efficient, online assessment in English language arts and mathematics for students in grades 3 through 10. MAP also offers science tests and a test for primary grades. MAP, which is new to Jeffco Public Schools this year, is unique in several ways:

- Tailored to individual students. The difficulty of each question is based on how well a student answers the previous question. As the student answers correctly, questions become more difficult. If the student answers incorrectly, the questions become easier. Finalscores provide an individually-tailored report of each student's achievement level. Progress and growth are precisely measured for each student, helping teachers to pinpoint individual instructional needs.
- Next day results. Teachers and students receive results the day after the MAP test is taken. These real-time results can be put to use right away to enhance quality planning and instruction.
- Time Savings. MAP tests typically take an hour, about half the time it took for previous exams. It also saves time for teachers because it is graded automatically.

A secure and private tool

Jeffco has worked hard to ensure MAP meets the strictest privacy and security standards. MAP has passed Jeffco's in-depth vendor approval process. This process measures the security and privacy of software by reviewing various technical features such as encryption, system logging, system roles, and incident response. Why is an assessment like this needed?

MAP assesses students on a range of content areas rather than focusing solely on skills at a particular grade level. Results from MAP tests given in the fall, winter, and spring help teachers track progress and growth in basic skills for each student throughout the school year. They let teachers know where a student's strengths are and if help is needed in any specific areas. Educators can use MAP data to identify trends across their classroom, compare their students' achievement with local and national norms, and strengthen instructional planning.

6th Grades Transitioning

August 2017

Dear West Jefferson Elementary Families & Staff,

As you may have heard, several Jeffco Public Schools' articulation areas are shifting sixth grade students to middle schools. Over the past several years, the district thoroughly examined the topic and last year decided to make the shift. The goal is to migrate current 7-8 middle schools to 6-8 middle school configurations district-wide, beginning with as many articulation areas as feasible in the fall of the 2018-19 school year. We are now moving forward on implementation; the sixth grade transition will begin next school year 2018-19. This introductory letter is to inform you of the process, answer some commonly asked questions, and explain what comes next.

Which middle schools will now have sixth grade and when?

The **Evergreen, Chatfield, and Conifer** articulation areas have already transitioned sixth graders to middle schools.

These middle schools will serve grades 6-8 beginning 2018-19:

 Arvada K-8 (Arvada) • Bell Middle (Golden) Carmody Middle (Bear Creek) • Drake Middle (Arvada West) Dunstan Middle (Green Mountain) • Everitt Middle (Wheat Ridge) Mandalay Middle (Standley Lake) (Option School) Manning • Moore Middle (Pomona) North Arvada Middle (Arvada)

Oberon Middle (Ralston Valley)
Wayne Carle Middle (Standley Lake)

The following three middle schools are scheduled to serve grades 6-8 in **2019-20** to allow time to plan for capacity and enrollment:

Creighton Middle (Lakewood)
 Ken Caryl Middle (Columbine)
 Summit Ridge Middle (Dakota Ridge)

Why are the sixth grade students in the Alameda and Jefferson areas remaining in their current elementary schools?

Two years ago, a process that engaged stakeholders resulted in a decision to implement a K-6/7-12 model. We are excited this model will continue because it is beneficial for students. In particular, students only experience one transition within the K-12 model.

How does this transition impact option schools?

Option schools, other than Manning, will remain unchanged.

6th Grades Transitioning, continued...

Why is Jeffco Public Schools transitioning sixth grade students from elementary school to middle school?

The 6-8 model allows for expanded academic opportunities for our students. The opportunity for students to be in a middle school for three years minimizes the drawbacks of the two-year "in/out" transition. Three years in the same school promotes the academic progress and social-emotional growth of students and encourages stronger student and family engagement. Students attending sixth grade in a middle school have access to a wider variety of electives in addition to art, music, and physical education. Students performing at high levels in math have greater access to accelerated courses. Science classes typically include more lab work and hands-on learning.

Jeffco Public Schools currently offers several 6-8 middle school options, and those experiences have been extremely positive. Nationally, 75 percent of sixth grade students are in a 6-8 middle school model.

What will remain the same for all sixth grade students regardless of program model?

Sixth grade students will continue to receive core instruction based on the Colorado Academic Standards regardless of program model. All schools are dedicated to meet the academic, social-emotional, and mental health needs of adolescents.

Will transitioning sixth grade students to middle school impact the Outdoor Lab experience?

No. Sixth grade students will continue to attend Outdoor Lab, regardless of program model.

How will this transition impact students in center-based (special education or gifted and talented) programs?

All students enrolled in center-based programs will be supported by both the sending and receiving schools. Students in **special education** center-based programs will work with special education staff to successfully transition with their classmates. Classroom teachers will also be supporting students and families in getting prepared for the transition.

Students in **gifted and talented** center programs are assured a continuous school experience:

- Evergreen and West Jefferson Middle Schools will continue to host GT Centers. There is no change in programming or location for these two middle schools.
- **Ken Caryl Middle School,** which serves the Chatfield articulation area, already transitioned sixth grade GT Center students this school year, 2017-18.
- **Creighton Middle School**, which serves the Lakewood articulation area, will transition sixth grade GT Center students in 2018-19. This will accommodate the articulation areas that are transitioning their elementary sixth grade students for the 2018-19 school year.
- Everitt Middle School and North Arvada Middle School will transition 6th grade GT Center students in 2018-19. This will accommodate the articulation areas that are transitioning their elementary sixth grade students for the 2018-19 school year.

Where can I learn more?

There will be on-going communication about the sixth grade transition to middle school as we move

forward, and many opportunities to have questions answered. Your school is the best source for information. You will receive more e-newsletters and be invited to parent/student meetings soon. There will also be a transition committee to help address any issues that arise. We are striving to address concerns early and consistently.

We look forward to this new opportunity for our students!
