Protein Snacks

We are very fortunate to be able to continue with our Protein Snacks for at least the 1st half of the year. Thanks again to the Tiny Town Foundation for their financial donation to start this wonderful and fun program. On the first school day of each week, we provide a protein snack to all students and staff. Usually this is about one hour after the start of the day. Students get a choice or can optout (this is rare!). Last year we provided a variety of choices each week. Some of these included cottage cheese, plain sea-salted popcorn, cheese sticks, beef jerky, veggies and hummus, almonds, slim jims and a few other items. We are trying to stretch our money to make it last for the whole year and you can help. Expeditionary Learning (EL)

As you have probably heard by now, we are implementing a new Reading and Writing curriculum this year. The new curriculum is very closely aligned with our beliefs and training around empowering students to be leaders of their own learning. The 3 main components of EL Education are as follows:

- Mastery of Knowledge and Skills
- Character
- High-Quality Student Work

The Vision and Mission of EL Education is as follows:

When students and teachers are engaged in work that is challenging, adventurous and meaningful, learning and achievement flourish. Our mission is to create classrooms where teachers can fulfill their highest aspirations, and students achieve more than they think possible, becoming active contributors to building a better world.

This aligns closely with our work around readers' and writers' workshop, increasing text complexity, increasing exposure to multiple texts (volume of reading), our work with social emotional learning, our efforts to bring more people into our school from our community and to connect more with the community, and our ongoing efforts to increase students engagement and ownership of their learning!

There are 4 Modules, each about 9 weeks long. Each Module is focused on a specific content or topic that students explore in-depth. The first Module for each grade are as follow:

Kindergarten: Building Literacy in a Collaborative Classroom: Toys and Play

1st Grade: Tools and Work

2nd Grade: Schools and Community

3rd Grade: Overcoming Learning Challenges Near and Far

4th Grade: Poetry, Poets, and Becoming Writers

5th Grade: Stories of Human Rights

Election Forum



In August the Jeffco Public Schools Board of Education will decide whether to ask our community for additional local school funding on the November ballot. Though specifics aren't determined, it is likely voters will be asked for school funding in the following ways:

A mill levy would significantly support Conifer's efforts to provide a quality education experience for <u>ALL</u> students in a caring learning environment. Our continued success is dependent on our ability to recruit and retain highly qualified and caring teachers that make a difference every day in the lives of our students.

A bond would directly support Conifer Schools' ability to provide innovative learning opportunities in state-of-the-art facilities that provides a safe and welcoming atmosphere. Better facilities inside our buildings as well as outside will lead to more opportunities for our students, families and greater Conifer community.

There will also be a statewide school funding item on the November ballot -- **Amendment 73**. Is a proposed income tax that would affect incomes above \$150,000 per year and "C" Corporations. If Amendment 73 is passed in November, Jeffco Public Schools would receive an increase in funding with a possibility of up to \$1,600 additional funding per student.


